GENERAL RULES AND GUIDELINES

All films must be submitted through **Withoutabox.com** or **Filmfreeway.com**

Films must be exactly 100 SPOKEN WORDS. Submission must include a final script to verify word count. Please email your script (with you full name and name of film) to **info@100wordsfilmfestival.com**

The 100 Words Film Festival graphics dept will add our trademarked graphic counter to all films that are accepted. Please be sure NOT to include a graphic counter and to leave the bottom left corner of frame free of text/graphics.

If your film is selected for the festival, please be ready to provide a full size, Apple ProRes, .MOV file. If you are unable to obtain this format, please contact us and we can assist. We want your film to look as sharp as possible when viewed by the public.

Films must have licensed clearances on all graphics, locations, logos, materials, music, and personal appearances before submitting.

Due to the word count aspect, all films MUST be presented in English or with English subtitles or dubbing. Any use of subtitles or dubbing may only contain 100 English words and must substantially match the native language.

Conjunctions like "it's" "that's" "can't" and hyphenated words like "forty-five" "mid-July" "self-assured" will be considered one (1) word.

Please pay attention to numbers and dates, "Two Hundred and Forty-five" would count as 4 words. The year "Nineteen Eighty-Two" would count as two (2) words.

Credit rolls may run up to 15 seconds at the end of your film.

Student Filmmakers must include a photo of a current, valid student ID or proof of enrollment when submitting. Please email to **info@100wordsfilmfestival.com**

If your film is accepted by the 100 Words Film Festival, please be prepared to send us a picture of the film's director (300dpi .tiff or .jpeg) and a Director's biography that is exactly 100 words.

All film genres will be accepted with the exception of films containing strong sexual content and/or gratuitous graphic violence.

There are several deadlines beginning August 13, 2018. Entry fees increase at each deadline. All Films MUST arrive at the 100 Words Film Festival office by September 24, 2018.
